 15 type of couple most satisfied in their relationships
- 16 message that a failure event has occurred18 other-oriented skills based on the knowledge and understanding gained in a specific intimate relationship
- 27 attempts to break up a relationship without explicitly stating the desire to do so
 29 subordinates' feeling more satisfied in their jobs the more their supervisors are able to influence higher-level decisions
- 30 a feeling of disontent arising from a desire for something someone else has 31 metaphor which demonstrates levels of self-disclosure
- 32 theory which states that people seek the greatest amount of reward with the least amount of cost
- 33 ignoring, laughing, or being silent in response to a hurtful message

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- responding with violence to a specific relational conflict or tension model of the relationships among family adaptability, cohesion, and communication crying, conceding, or apologizing in response to a hurtful message theory that suggests that all loving relationships can be described according to 3 dimensions: intimacy, commitment, and passion 10
- 11 relationship in which both partners behave toward power in the same way, either both wanting it or both avoiding it

- 22 movement of a relationship away from intimacy through stages such as turmoil or stagnation, deintensification, individualization, etc.
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- 23 using violence to control or dominate24 relationship in which power shifts back and forth between the partners, depending on the situation
- 25 deception by commission involving outright falsification of information intended to deceive the listener
- 26 2 adults and their children; because of divorce, separation, death or adoption, children are the offspring of other biological parents or of just one of the adults who are raising them
